

Dr. April Johnson is an Animal Health Officer in Veterinary Public Health at the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) working on various veterinary public health topics including antimicrobial resistance, rabies and brucellosis. She holds a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from the University of Illinois and has a PhD in Virology and an MPH in Epidemiology from the University of Florida. She joined the FAO at the beginning of 2017 after working for three years in Azerbaijan on capacity development for human and animal health professionals for the detection, diagnosis and response of especially dangerous pathogens with the US Defense Threat Reduction Agency's Cooperative Biological Engagement Program. Previous positions include Assistant Professor of Veterinary Public Health and Epidemiology at Purdue University College of Veterinary Medicine in the US, and as a Veterinary Epidemiologist in the Influenza Division of the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
